Helen Bond Doyle Brown died January 28, 2015. She was born to Ethel and George Doyle on May 10th, 1923 in Somerville, NJ. Helen graduated from Somerville High School & Trenton State Teacher's College ('44) . She married her college sweetheart, Arthur Brown. They lived in Newington, CT and Plainfield, NJ. The highlight of their early marriage was the year they spent in Athens, Greece where she taught at the Anglo-American School in Psychico. Art was a Fulbright professor working to establish a national physical therapy program. While there, they were honored to have met the King and Queen of Greece. Helen taught 24 years in the public school system in Plainfield and 15 plus years as an American History teacher at The Wardlaw-Hartridge School. Helen was a member of the DAR, several women's clubs, historical societies, garden and book clubs, as well as the Carrier Foundation Auxiliary. Summers were spent with family and friends in Sag Harbor, LI. Her interests in antiques, art, history and gardening lasted her lifetime. Helen's greatest project was restoring her childhood home in Belle Mead, which has been in her family since she was 3 yrs old.
